We will have a copy in everyone's mailbox with enough advanced notice to be voted on at the Local meetings in April.

I thank the rank-and-file members, and the DC 6 staff, who were a part of the bylaw committee. We all worked hard to develop these bylaws, which will be our governing document for the next five years.

In April, all Local meetings will be Special Called Meetings for the purpose of voting on DC 6 bylaw changes.

Also, I am happy to report we were able to lower dues for the majority of the members of DC 6.

INTERNATIONAL UPDATES

Our District Council is fully affiliated with the International Union of Painters and Allied Trades, and we work closely with the representatives of the International Union to ensure we operate in harmony with federal labor law and the stated goals of the Union.

We had the pleasure of hosting General Vice President Harry Zell at our February Delegates meeting.

Brother Zell expressed his gratitude to all the members, who participated in the public comments for the legislative proposal known as Industry-Regulated Apprenticeship Programs (IRAPs). The over 17,000 comments against this harmful proposal set a new record!

He also brought the Delegates up to speed on the latest efforts by paint manufacturer PPG to break into the labor supply market.

We feel this is our business, and they should stick to making paint.

If you are asked to take part in any concerted actions regarding PPG, let the signs and flyers do the talking, and thank you in advance for the help.

LOOKING AHEAD

Join up with other good union folks in 2020 for some of our marguis events: The Day of Action in April, where we apply our skills and generosity to help the community, and our DC 6 Summer Picnics, which will be held at both Cedar Point (June 6) and King's Island (June 20).



Government Affairs

STRONGSVILLE — Recently, one of our members asked me why our

union is involved in politics?

Essentially, he feels politicians are all crooked and do not care about us or our families. He felt any resources the union spends on political action are a waste of time and money.

I always appreciate members asking questions of their representatives. I wish more members would ask questions – about any subject – rather than just assume they know why certain things are done.

I understood this member's frustrations, but disagreed with his assumptions. If this union did not involve itself in politics, we would be providing a major disservice to our members.

Some level of government – either federal, state or local – directly influences the majority of jobs on which our members work.

Many times, the construction projects most of us work on are funded directly by some level of government. Other times, the projects are supplemented by some form of corporate welfare, such as incentive grants or tax breaks, which help projects move forward.

There are government land banks, which provide property for projects, or the government provides infrastructure to help projects move forward. These types of government support – either direct or indirect – give our members places to go to work every day.

Every level of government has the potential to influence our members and their family's dinner table issues.

Look at the federal government in Washington, where the White House and Senate are not worker friendly, but the House is. I recently wrote about vicious attacks on our collective bargaining system and organizing rights by the Department of Labor.

We have seen attacks promoting IRAPs, which is an attack on our lifeblood of registered apprenticeship programs.

We have seen inaction on any possible help for our pensions.

Our President, who ran for office on claims that he is a builder, has done nothing to push any kind of infrastructure improvement plan.

I wrote an article on the PRO Act, the first real attempt to improve labor laws in decades. This bill finally passed the House, but has zero chance to be discussed in the Senate, and certainly, the President is opposed to it and would never sign it.

Now, look at Ohio, where the Republicans hold the Governor's office, all statewide offices and have a super majority in both the Senate and the House.

Unlike Washington, there are a number of building trades union friendly Republicans to go with the Democrats in order to make some good things happen for us and zero bad things in Columbus.

I wrote about the gas tax increase, which created funds for our highways and bridges and created jobs for our members.

Almost all the states around Ohio have passed So-Called "Right to Work" laws and eliminated Prevailing Wage and Project Labor Agreements.

Here, because of the collaborative work of many, combined with fair openminded representatives, we have avoided those attacks.

Various local governments have also passed rules and regulations to help our members. Some of these include responsible contractor language in their bid documents, which help our contractors be competitive by eliminating bad actor contractors.

Others have passed wage theft ordinances to help make sure all workers are fairly paid and not allow their employers to steal part of their wages.

Some localities have included language in bid specifications for their water and sewer projects, which help our highly trained and qualified members work on those projects. Other localities require PLAs on projects exceeding certain monetary thresholds.

Our Governmental Affairs department is constantly watching and involving ourselves in all of these types of government actions.

It has a tremendous effect on our members and their families.

The amount of resources this District Council commits to Governmental Affairs is actually quite small, but the importance is high.

I am proud to direct this department under the leadership of BMST **Jim Sherwood**.

We will be very busy throughout 2020, and if we ask for your help, hope-fully we can count on you.

When we endorse a candidate, we hope you will give serious consideration to supporting the candidate.

Thank you to those who take the time to read my articles.



Our marketing team is working on getting our contractors working for various general contractors, who have not used union contractors before.


I have been sending jobs to our contractors to bid on almost every week. Hopefully, this will generate some work for the members.
