In the eight years I have had the pleasure to serve as Business Manager for DC 6, I have participated in hundreds of discussions, along with other agents of the Council.

Sometimes these discussions are a realization that we are all in the same industry and a true partnership exists among mutually respectful groups.

A new contract is signed, and we all go to work.

Occasionally, the group across the table from the DC 6 team, an association or a single shop, feels the need to strip the contract from everything that makes it a union-negotiated agreement.

I will tell you in plain English that as long as I serve as BM/ST, this will not see the light of day on the voting floor.

Our industry partners, should they wish to continue accessing the most skilled, certified and reliable work force in the nation, can either work with us on a living wage and benefits package, or they can deal with work stoppages.

The Second Primary election, possibly taking place in August, will be for state legislative seats.

The reason for this is simple, the Election Committee, more specifically the Republicans on this committee, refused to follow the Ohio Constitution, which is very clear on the requirements and was passed in overwhelming numbers by the voters in Ohio.

We have supported these Republicans in the past and likely will in the future, but their actions here are inexcusable.

We will likely never agree on everything any politician does, but their efforts here are based around the Republicans wanting to pick their voters instead of the voter picking their representatives.

It is not what the voters and the law require. They should do the job we hired them to do.

#### **NABTU CONFERENCE**

In early April, I attended the North American Building Trades Legislative Conference in Washington, D.C.

The conference included an impressive lineup of Democratic and Republican speakers, including our own Rep. Tim Ryan (D-Youngstown), and card-carrying union member and U.S. Secretary of Labor Marty Walsh.

The final speaker of the event was President Joe Biden, who talked about the infrastructure bill and his Executive Order mandating PLAs on federal projects over \$35 million. The most Pro Union President in decades told us our time was now and urged us to go organize and improve the livelihood for all workers across our country.

He was very well received by the attendees.

Over the two days of the conference, I attended all the sessions and the Ohio State Building Trades breakfast, I also had the opportunity to represent our members and have one-on-one discussions with Sen. Sherrod Brown (D-OH) and Ryan, who is running for U.S. Senate, on three separate occasions.

I also had the honor of some oneon-one time with Rep. Shontel Brown (D-Cleveland) and with Rep. Bill Johnson (R-Marietta).

All of these elected officials are busy and in high demand, and taking time to meet with me, the representative of DC 6, is a credit to you and your hard work both on the job and with our governmental affairs activism.

I finished the week off by spending a couple days in training with some of the other Political Directors from across the IUPAT, mainly concerning the 2022 elections.

I did learn that Ohio will be a Tier 1 state again this year, so many resources and effort will go into our State.

Different labor groups and even DC 6 may disagree on some candidates, but one we are all in on is Tim Ryan for U.S. Senate. His election will not only be Priority One for DC 6, but it will be a focal point for the nation.

Hopefully, many of you will help us make sure Tim makes it to the U.S. Senate, where we could easily say we have two senators who truly support organized labor.

#### **IUPAT POLLING**

Lastly, the IUPAT hired a professional polling company to find out our member's thoughts and beliefs on many issues, not just politics.

Almost all the polling will be done by phone so, if you receive a call from a group wanting to ask guestions, and they say they are representing the IUPAT, it is a legitimate thing.
