The skilled workers of this union are the best around, and upholding them with fair wages and good benefits is what every day is all about.

I thank everyone who gave my team their vote of confidence in both 2014 and 2018.

During those years we modernized our building stock with the Toledo and Youngstown acquisitions.

In these locations, we purchased and outfitted existing structures to provide meeting and training spaces we previously did not have.

All transactions are governed by the DC 6 Building Corporation (composed of Council Delegates), which has also voted to sell off a piece of unused property in Strongsville to the mortgage company neighbor.

This will provide funds for much needed repairs at the training center in this location.

### **CBA UPDATES**

I want to bring everyone up to date on the Collective Bargaining Agreements that expired in April and May:

• Locals 707 and 1103 - We had three tentative agreements (three votes) and after a one-week strike, the CBA was settled.

• Local 1162 - We had three tentative agreements (three votes) and after a two-day strike, the CBA was settled.

 Local 847 (Consolidated Glass) - We had three tentative agreements (three votes) and settled without a strike.

 Locals 123 and 238 – We had two tentative agreements (two votes) and settled without a strike.

• Local 476 - At this point, one tentative agreement was rejected.

#### **UPCOMING ELECTIONS**



This will be a busy year for campaigns and elections, both in the national midterms and in District Council 6.

We are all-in for Tim Ryan in the race to determine Ohio's next U.S. Senator!

Sometimes we back candidates who are "friends of labor."

In backing Tim, we are supporting someone who is labor. He is a champion of workers' rights and will always have our back in the Senate.

The District Council Elections will be held on June 18 from 6 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. all around the Council.

Most usual meeting sites are hosting the vote. However, if you are unsure of where you should vote, please call 440-239-4575.

Prior to voting, there are three things to note of great importance:

• First, bring a photo ID or the Mobile Member Portal with your photo.

 Second, you can vote in any active voting site (only once, of course).

• Third, there is no campaigning inside the polling place or within the designated campaigning boundary. The IUPAT has concluded that this extends to the wearing or display of campaign slogans, t-shirts or paraphernalia. The Election Committee will enforce this decision at every site.

#### LOCAL OFFICERS/ DELEGATES

Also in June, every Local Union will elect Local officers and delegates to the District Council.

Please get involved and stay informed by attending Local meetings whenever possible.

STRONGSVILLE — Shortly after vou read this article, the District Council elections will take place, and once the results are tallied, the structure of the staff will come into focus.

There is an old saving that elections have consequences, and that is true with Union elections, too.

So, as hopeful as I am that I will continue to be honored to be your Governmental Affairs Director, it is possible this will be my last article in this position.

I serve at the discretion of our BMST, so if the members elect a new BMST, that BMST has the right to appoint his or her own people, meaning anything could happen.

I really enjoy this position. I take it very seriously and believe we have represented the members of this Council well.

Again, I hope to continue in this position, but if I do not, please know it has been the highest honor of my professional career to serve as the Director of Governmental Affairs for the members DC 6 and their families.

#### **PRIMARY ELECTION** RESULTS

The results are in for this year's first primary in Ohio. At the top of the ticket, Mike DeWine will be the Republican candidate for Ohio Governor, while Nan Whaley won the Democratic nomination. DC 6 did not endorse in either primary and has not yet made a decision on an endorsement for November.

Tim Ryan easily won the Democratic primary for U.S. Senate, while J. D. Vance won the Republican Primary. We endorsed Tim Ryan for this seat, and this will be the highest priority race for November.

Many other races were set for November, and I urge you to follow us on Facebook and Twitter to keep up with our endorsements as they come.

The state legislative primary for

Ohio House and Ohio Senate will likely be in August.

This unusual primary is simply because of ineffective governing by the Election Commission.

I am not sure if I have ever seen a group of representatives literally thumb their nose at the voters and the courts simply to try to maintain power in Columbus. They should be ashamed of themselves, especially considering most of these representatives have a longdistinguished career of public service.

They likely will continue to serve the public well, but they sure spit the bit with the redistricting.

#### **INTERNAL IUPAT** POLLING

Lastly, the IUPAT hired a professional polling company to find out the thoughts and beliefs of our members on many issues, not just politics.

Almost all polling will be done by phone, so if you receive a call from a group wanting to ask questions and they say they are representing the IUPAT, it is a legitimate thing.

Spend some time and answer their questions if you would like, but know it is the only way the leaders of our Union can truly have a good feel for the membership.

We can have a good feel locally and even across our Council, but those in Hanover have a harder time getting a feel for our thoughts.

We are also in need of drywall finishers in Dayton.

#### TANKS AND BRIDGES

The water initiative is another focus our team has been working on heavily, specifically with tanks and bridges.

Our primary target is Seven Brothers, and we will remain on their trail, ready to wrap them up with hand billing or job actions, if necessary.

The Organizing team will be going to job bids on tanks and bridges throughout our council.

Drywall finishers are needed in Youngstown.

There is a need for both drywall finishers and paper hangers in Toledo.

If you are planning to retire soon, please call the Pension Office at 216-447-3412 to set up an appointment to begin your paperwork.


You must apply within 90 days of your intended retirement date, and all paperwork must be completed 45 days prior to your intended retirement date.
