STRONGSVILLE — I'm going to brief this month, as hopefully everyone understands how important every election is, and how it impacts our members and their families.

As we have seen many times during the Biden Presidency, one or two votes, especially in the U.S. Senate, can make or break important bills.

The Pro Act was passed by the House, but we cannot get a vote in the Senate, as not one Republican supports the bill and not even all 50 Democrats support it.

This means you could not even hope to break the filibuster to get it passed. Tim Ryan would get us one vote closer, as he voted for the bill in the House and said he if elected, he would support it in the Senate.

Not one Republican House member from Ohio supported that bill, and we are not endorsing any of them this election.

We have endorsed Democratic House candidates Marcy Kaptur, Joyce Beatty, Shontel Brown, Emilia Sykes and Greg Landsman.

Please consider voting for these candidates if you live in their district.

REGISTER TO VOTE

We always urge our members and families to vote. However, that cannot happen if you are not registered to vote or have been purged for inactivity.

It is a simple process to become eligible to vote.

You can register to vote online or check to confirm your registration.

This can be done by simply searching Ohio Secretary of State and register to vote, or you can go to ohiosos.gov.

Our representatives will have fliers and those flyers will be also available at the Union Hall. They have a QR code that you can scan to begin this process. If you call and ask, we will bring one out to the jobsite.

Please register yourself and your entire family.

I just had the privilege of helping my grandson register to vote.

Voter registration for this year's General Election ends on Oct. 11. Early voting starts on Oct. 12.

INFORMING OUR MEMBERS

Lastly, you can expect a mailing or two from the District Council about the importance of electing Tim Ryan, and possibly other targeted mailings in specific districts.

Our staff will have fliers on various jobsites and at Union Halls. We also may be calling or stopping by your house with information.
