INDUSTRIAL/ BRIDGE WORK

Bridge painting work has concluded. Thanks to a strong partnership with our signatory employers, all the workers in this specialized craft earned an honorable wage and benefits package throughout the season.

Our organizing team handles industrial painting on many fronts – legislatively, for example, through supporting laws that require painters be expertly trained.

We also engage in direct monitoring of public works and the accompanying payroll reports filed with the state or commonwealth. This helps us verify the hours worked and the number of workers present each day.

We attend bid openings to learn how our signatory partners fared, and with whom we may need to partner next in our mission to represent skilled workers.

We constantly reach out to the nonunion workers we meet, who show an interest in building a future with the IUPAT.

Finally, the FTIOR conducts an extensive battery of training sessions in the off-season for our industrial contractors. This keeps the workers current with certifications like lift training and the Certified Application Specialist (CAS).

As new products and work specifications come along, the Training Department will adapt and make sure we are always the most prepared workforce in the business.

COLUMBUS UPDATE

As most people involved in the construction industry know, Columbus is the hot spot, maybe in the entire country when it comes to construction.

The leadership at DC 6 believes this is an opportunity of a lifetime to grow our membership.

of disappointments, but not many surprises. Overall, it was not a bad day for building trades friendly candidates.

I am confident we have people at every level of government who we can work with and who understand the issues our members and their families face.

I thank everyone who volunteered, talked to their co-workers or family, voted or in any other way helped this election be a success.

The importance of all our members and their families voting can never be underestimated.

I want to point out one race, which clearly shows this to be true.

Ohio House District 5, which is in the southern portion of Franklin County, had a very close race between incumbent Richard Brown (Democrat) and Ronald Brown (Republican) in a newly drawn gerrymandered district.

The election night results showed our endorsed candidate, Rich Brown, lost the election by 96 votes. However, once all the absentee and provisional ballots were counted, Rich Brown won the district by 145 votes.

There will be a mandated recount, but this proves every vote really counts. Even if you must vote absentee or

I cannot stress enough the importance of having a current drug card.

Also, stay on top of your yearly test. Do not let it lapse.

A lot of members miss out on work because they do not have a current drug card. Do not let that be you.

Remember, random drug tests are going out. Do not miss a random, which is equivalent to a fail.

If you have any questions, call me, and I can get you set up with the test. If you need a drug test, contact me.

Stay on top of your upgrade classes and all the certifications, as training is becoming more important.


